## EDITORIAL

### DO IT TODAY!

Since the latest issue of The Advocate, there has been much talk concerning the pending revision of the Arizona Criminal Code presently before our Legislature. It is indeed frightening to find out that there still are people in high places with minds that are so closed that they do not know what is happening around them. We, of course, are to blame because, almost without exception, these are elected officials. We have the power to put them in office, and we certainly have the power to throw them out. It is certainly not this paper's intention to be a political entity, but when we see someone or something that will affect our lifestyle adversely we feel forced to speak out.

Much of what is contained in the amendment and the proposed revisions as they pertain to homosexuality is truly unconstitutional and would probably never get passed by the Attorney General's office. There is, however, that big word probably. We should never let such legislation even get that close to being introduced. In talking with various legal minds, they were even surprised to hear about these pending revisions, so it has been kept secret from the public. It has been said that copies have been made for only a select few and that the strongest opponent against these new proposed revisions, the Arizona A.C.C.U., had to borrow a copy from a friendly source to learn what our legislature was doing with our rights.

We do have rights. We must protect them. We are not criminals and we cannot have laws passed that would make criminals out of us. We have the strength. We must keep our heads and think logically as a group. We must stop this petty thinking by our elected officials and get people in office who are at least into the 20th century.

To make sure that the criminal code revisions, as they pertain to Gays, are eliminated, we urge you to write to your district representatives, Senators, Attorney General and the Governor. Let them know what you think. Let them know that they do have many thousands of homosexuals in their districts who want to be represented fairly and squarely. This cannot be a spotty campaign. We must all write and voice our objections. We have the strength and we must do it.

# AFTER HOURS

The Tucson Police Department has notified all bars, straight and gay, that beginning December 1st they will begin enforcing sections 11-17 and 11-18 of the Tucson City Code. Both of these sections prohibit loitering in or frequenting drinking establishments between the hours of 1:15 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any weekday or between 1:15 a.m. and noon on Sunday. In effect this will do away with any bar having after hours.

After contacting the City Prosecutors office, we were notified that indeed the city police will enforce the code strictly. This ordinance does not affect private clubs. The P.S. Club will continue having after hours on their regular nights, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday.

Jekyll's and Hyde's has announced that after this weekend, they will no longer be open after hours. No other Gay bar has had after hours recently.

# LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

It seems to me that the State of Arizona is proposing a law that is totally antiquated, and a blatant slap in the face of the "freedom" we are all supposed to hold so sacred.

In the Nov. 17th issue of The Advocate #203, two articles appeared. Both are upsetting to me.

The first was the decision of Judge Ben C. Birdsall to grant probation to the killers of Richard J. Henkin. I have lived in Tucson all my life, so this decision was not surprising but I hope that this time the Gay Community will not let it be swept under the rug so simply. Judge Birdsall is quoted as saying, "The four youths and their parents have been punished enough." I am sorry, but I feel this attitude toward Gay people is disgusting. I feel sure that if the tables had been turned and thirteen guys had purposely waited outside a straight bar to "beat up a straight" and proceeded to kill someone by accident, Judge Birdsall's decision would have been different.

The second article was even more depressing. It is one thing to be swept under a rug by one man's sense of right, but to have the State of Arizona decide that you, as a general group, should stay under that rug and get walked on is quite another.

This proposed revision to the Criminal code is a concept right out of the Spanish Inquisition. Who is anyone to tell two consenting adults what they can or cannot do in the privacy of their own homes.
